RFHS TOUR - Wednesday - June 16, 2021 GEOLOGY DRIVING & HIKING TOUR ROBERTS RANCH With Margie & Larry Caswell & D. L. Roberts

Margie and Larry will lead us on a tour of the geology in the area including McNey Hill, Eagle's Nest and Owl Canyon. D. L. Roberts with lead us on a hike into the Roberts Ranch where you will see Teepee Rings and Signature Rock plus many geology sites. You will be able to see and identify a variety of geologic formations, minerals and rocks on this tour.

Roberts family settled on this land in 1874 two years before Colorado was a state. Roberts Ranch is an American icon - a remnant of the days when one could strike out on his own in an effort to claim a piece of land out of sheer will and fortitude. Home to a working cattle ranch of 17,000 acres, the ranch has belonged to the Roberts family since they settled on the property, and it represents a dying breed of private land stewards with a conservation easements which mean it will remain open space in perpetuity. It is now in a charitable trust.



RFHS TOUR - PHANTOM CANYON NATURE CONSERVANCY WALKING TOUR - Wednesday - July 21, 2021 - Only a few spots still available



The Nature Conservancy's Phantom Canyon Preserve represents an increasingly rare commodity in Colorado; an unfragmented Front Range landscape and the last intact transition from the Great Plains into the Rocky Mountains. The Preserve is a refuge for an impressive diversity of wildlife, more than 200 species of birds and over 600 species of plants. The Preserve harbors 1,120 acres of rugged granite canyon country carved by seven miles of the North Fork of the Cache La Poudre River, which flows through the Preserve. You will participate in a walking guided tour and experience several sites of nature.



RFHS TOUR - Wednesday - August 18, 2021- 8:30 am - 3:00 pm **MISHAWAKA by Gary Duvall & THE LOWER POUDRE with Jan Gueswel**

On a spring afternoon in 1916, musician and motorcycle-traveling adventurer Walter S. Thompson was riding through the sparsely inhabited Poudre Canyon when he heard a song from the land too clear and powerful to ignore. The majestic mountain vistas and idyllic riverbank setting sang the notes of a sacred place and Thompson decided then and there to fulfill his dance hall dreams. Thompson homesteaded the property and spent the next several years building the Mishawaka Dance Hall by hand. Three years later, the Mishawaka was born and Thompson's wife and children were reunited with him in this Poudre Canyon paradise. The Mishawaka quickly earned its time-tested reputation as a destination for music and celebration beyond compare. Over the decades the Mishawaka's ownership changed hands, vacation cabins came and went, and countless

performers took to the riverside stage. And like the river, the music flows on.

THE COLORADO ALABASTER INDUSTRY by Jason Marmor

Jason Marmor is a professional historian who has lived in Colorado (Larimer County) since 1992. He currently serves as Senior Historian for CDOT Region 4 where he is responsible for historic preservation regulatory compliance for transportation projects in 13 counties in



northeastern and eastern Colorado. In his prior life as a historic preservation consultant, Jason was intrigued by mentions of alabaster mining in Fort Collins city directories and in one project he documented the vacant home and roadside alabaster stand in Loveland formerly occupied by the Proctor family, whose legacy is now displayed in the Loveland Museum and Gallery. Wanting to preserve its history, Jason embarked on a many-years-long obsession to uncover the history of this fascinating, obscure and innovative industry.

Riding Plow



The single furrow riding plow was used to prepare a field for the next crop sometime after the harvest of the previous crop was completed. The plowing was usually done in the fall or sometimes in the spring when the frost was out of the ground and the weather was warmer. The soil turned was usually 6-9 inches deep and 12-16 inches wide depending on the operator's plow settings. Over time, plows became available with more blades when tractors became available. The plow displayed was used on the Maxwell Ranch for many years.
